# The Annual Report for the year 2020 of the Trustees of St.Andrew's Church, Kenn, EX6 7UR in the Diocese of Exeter; known as Kenn PCC

This report is produced by the PCC as trustees in accordance with the guidelines set out in "The Charities Act and the PCC 1993 revised 2006"

The PCC's main role is to Promote the Ecclesiastical Parish of Kenn: the whole mission of the Church: and to co-operate in this with our Mission Community of Kenn, Kenton, Exminster, Mamhead and Powderham.

There are four sub-committees; The Standing Committee, The Buildings Committee, The Social Committee and the Mission Committee. These committees meet as required and make recommendations for the PCC to agree at their bi-monthly meetings.

#### **Treasurers Report on the Receipts and Expenditure statement - 2020**

#### Overview

The introduction of COVID19 restrictions in March placed unprecedented strain on St.Andrew's income stream. A very successful Appeal for funds late in the year, an unexpected Grant from Kenn Parish Council and an unexpected legacy went a considerable way to almost mitigating our anticipated losses and we ended the year with an excess of Expenditure over Receipts and a **deficit of \pounds1491.** 

#### Current Account

The current account was depleted by £1704 in 2020 with a closing balance of £15156. £2399 of this balance represents restricted funds.

#### Deposit Account

It was not necessary to utilise any funds from the deposit account during 2020 despite the pandemic impact. The closing balance of  $\pm 33269$  gives headroom of  $\pm 8269$  above the PCC's agreed retained reserve.

#### Core Receipts

St.Andrew's receipts for Cash Collections and Gift Aid Collections have been considerably reduced: Parish Giving Scheme, Planned Giving, and Income tax recovered held up but PCC Fees were much reduced.

#### Social Receipts

COVID19 restrictions eliminated Social Receipts this year. A significant loss. Sponsorship payments made in anticipation of a May Fayre in 2020 of £365 are retained in the current account. These will be carried forward.

#### Legacies

St.Andrew's received a legacy of £1000 in 2020 from the estate of a Mrs Handley. The legacy restricts the funds to maintenance and repair of the Church building

#### <u>Grants</u>

St.Andrew's received a very welcome grant of £1000 from Kenn Parish Council for maintenance of the Churchyard for the second consecutive year.

#### Investment Receipts

Investment Receipts remain in line with the general investment market and although still a gain, the gain is smaller reflecting the impact of the Pandemic on the Financial markets.

#### Common Fund

Despite St.Andrew's financial difficulties this year this request was **paid in full** to the Diocese. (£18987)

A cautious approach to the payment of the Common Fund for 2021 is being adopted to reduce the monthly outgoing cashflow to match predictable income.\_

#### Utility costs

Utility costs are down as heating and water requirements were reduced by Church temporary closure.

#### Social Expenditure

Deposit payments for the cancelled May Fayre of £367 have been made from the current account. Hopefully these deposits will be honoured in the future. (However is should be noted that the Current account holds £365 of offsetting sponsorships)

#### Charitable Expenditure

This year all proceeds from the Lent Lunches held before the COVID19 restrictions came into force (£448) was donated on an equal basis to two charities: The Dystonia UK Society and St.Petrocs. St. Andrew's also continued to support the Children's Society with a donation of £126 and Samuel Sarkar with donations of £300 for his missionary work. £25 was given to other local causes.

#### Payments Outstanding

As at 31/12/2019 the Royal British Legion has not presented a cheque for £254 for payment.

#### Foreign Currency

As at 31/12/2020 overseas currency of \$132.00 and  $\in 20.00$  is held pending exchange in 2021.

#### Returned Cheque

A cheque for £100 was returned as payment declined. This amount has been deducted from the General Appeal total.

#### Payments to Diocese relating to 2019

£683 of Fee payments made to the Diocese during 2020 relate to 2019

<u>Tours</u>

Because of COVID19 restrictions no tours were hosted in 2020. This equates to a significant income loss of around £4000.

### <u>Outlook</u>

Current account balance and reserves remain adequate to meet St.Andrew's immediate financial needs, even during the continuing Pandemic, despite the small loss of income this year. There are too many unknowns to project how St.Andrew's will ultimately fare financially in 2021 but as a result of the very successful 2020 appeal the outlook is optimistic.

This report on the financial statements of the PCC for the year ended 31 December 2020, which are set out on the attached pages, is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 ('the Regulations') and s.145 of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

Respective responsibilities of the PCC and the examiner

As members of the PCC you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements; you consider that the audit requirement of the Regulations and s.144(2) of the Act does not apply. It is my responsibility to issue this report on those financial statements in accordance with the terms of the Regulations.

#### Basis of this report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under s.145(5)(b) of the Act and to be found in the Church guidance, 2006 edition. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
